The children have been working on prayers for Remembrance Day,




Dear God,

If your child was born on or between **1 September 2013** and **31 August 2014**, you need to apply for a primary school place now.

You must still apply even if your child already attends a nursery attached to the school.

Deadline for applications is

15th January 2018
